Conditions of Entry

This show will be conducted under the Rules of the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. as set out in the current AAA Ltd. Showing Rules Manual. All exhibitors are also required to be familiar with the Administrative Protocol for Exhibitors and Organisers when attending NSW Southern Region organised alpaca shows. All exhibitors should read the conditions on the entry form and ensure that they can comply with those conditions before signing the entry form, particularly noting the condition dealing with animal health. A separate health declaration will be provided for signature and return with the entry form. Alpacas traveling interstate must comply with that State's Department of Primary Industry requirements.

A separate entry form is required for each Stud/Exhibitor. Please note that only the registered owner of an exhibit, or his/her authorised agent may sign an entry form. The registered owner of an exhibit must be a financial member of the AAA Ltd. Failure to sign the entry form will render those entries ineligible to be exhibited.

Exhibitors will receive an email confirming their entries have been received and entered into the show system. Once received Exhibitors must check details to confirm these are correct. If they are incorrect Exhibitors must return the email detailing the error(s).

Period of Exhibition

Upon arrival exhibitors need to report to the administration desk to obtain their pen positions, show catalogues and animal exhibit cards. Alpacas can be optionally penned between:

- 3pm and 6pm on Friday 25th May 2018 or
- 7am to 8.30 am on Saturday 26th May 2018 or
- 7am to 8.30 am on Sunday 27th May 2018.

All animals must be penned by 8.30 am on the day of their class being judged – refer to the **Timetable of Classes** as this is critical.

Animals may be removed from the venue after the completion of judging on their respective day of judging, again the order of judging is critical.

Removal of animals:

- Exhibitors are not permitted to remove animals from the venue during the show, unless they have permission of the convener.
- Exhibitors are not permitted to remove animals from the venue whilst the judge is in the show ring.
- Those leaving early, without permission or whilst the judge is in the show ring, will be asked to put their alpacas back into their pens and this action may jeopardise their attendance at future shows.
- The convener is happy to be flexible with exhibitors leaving early, with permission, however exhibitors are reminded that they are not permitted to load alpacas or leave the venue whilst the judge is in the show ring.
- Those leaving early, without permission or whilst the judge is in the show ring, may jeopardise flexible leave times for all exhibitors at future Carousel of Colour Shows.

Please be respectful of the judge, the convener and your fellow exhibitors and abide by the above period of exhibition rules.

Every effort will be made to conclude proceedings by 4pm on each day of judging. Judging to commence 9am each day. **Security** will be provided for Friday and Saturday nights.

Inspection of Exhibits

The inspection of all alpacas will be conducted between 7am - 8.30am Saturday 28th and Sunday 29st May 2016.

When an exhibitor is ready to have their animals inspected they should report to the administration desk to arrange inspection. Inspections will be conducted in the animal pen. Alpacas not in their allocated pens and available for inspection at the arranged time may be disqualified by the Chief Steward. Exhibitors must be in attendance at the time of the inspection and will be required to assist.

All alpacas must be registered with the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. and carry an approved brass tag showing the alpaca's IAR number. No animal shall be eligible for exhibition if it is not entire. All genitalia shall be complete, properly formed and proportioned for normal reproduction. NOTE: If there is no IAR tag present in the ear of an animal exhibit, official Association confirmation must be provided by the owner to the Chief Steward that the ear tag has been recently lost and that a new tag has been ordered and paid for. Replacement tag orders and payments must be lodged with the National Office a minimum of one week before the date of the show. Failure to present such advice at inspection will result in disqualification of the animal. Inspections Stewards shall inspect all alpacas for genetic faults, colour class and IAR number and visible physical disfigurement. The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for age, sex and colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class which, in his/her opinion, it should have been entered.

Age of Alpaca

Alpacas must be entered into the correct class for their age, (i.e. age in full months, on the day of the Show unless otherwise specified). The date of the show is defined as Saturday 26th May 2018.

Electric Fans and Appliances

Breeders requiring power for electric fans must pre-book and pay for their power supply. Cost for power and installation is \$40 per exhibitor. Breeders MUST ensure any personally owned fans and electrical appliances have been tested by a qualified electrician and has a current compliance tag attached. Fans and appliances that do not have a current test tag will not be permitted. Due to public safety requirements, power extension cables across public walkways will not be permitted.

Catering

On site catering will be available from Saturday morning through until Sunday afternoon.

Dinner

Dinner Saturday night - stay and have a meal with friends. Onsite. \$30 per person. Covers nibbles, main meal (BBQ and heaps of salads) and desert. BYO alcohol. Soft drinks will be for sale. We might even have a little bit of disco dancing after dinner!

* Conditional on how many people book for dinner. If we don't get enough numbers then we will cancel and refund money paid. Confirmation will occur after entries have closed.

Site Details



The event is being held at the Goulburn Show Grounds on Braidwood Road.

Directions travelling from the south on the Hume Highway:

- Turn off at Goulburn near the large round about. This is called Hume Street.
- Hume Street changes to Cowper Street about 2-3 kilometres on the street.
- At the T-intersection turn right onto Clinton Street.
- At the T-intersection turn right onto Sloane Street.
- Turn left onto Braidwood Road.
- Turn left into Gate 6. The venue is on your left.

The venue is a metal shed with cement floors and is fully enclosable. Note: In May the venue will be cold.

Parking is available on site with a secure area for floats.

The venue is made up of two sections - the Pavilion and Skillion. The Pavilion is the main section which is fully enclosed. The Skillion is an open roof section, off the Pavilion, where the shows services are located (e.g. security, seating areas).

Safety Information

The shows First Aid Officer is: *Angela Smith*. The first aid kit and Incident Report Forms are located at the administration desk.

During the event, if an exhibitor notices a hazard (e.g. slippery wet floors, trip hazard or sharp edges) please report this to the Convener, so it can be fixed before any person or an alpaca gets hurt.

The site is a shared space (vehicles, livestock and people) therefore there is an 8 kmls per hour speed limit once vehicles have entered the site.

Animals are to enter via the front entrance only. For safety reasons, access via the skillion area is not permitted.

Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring their allocated pens are secure and that they are used throughout the event in such a way that they do not fall and cause injury.

Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring all marketing material is installed correctly and in such a way that it does not fall and cause injury. Exhibitors must use an appropriate ladder when installing marketing material at height.

Exhibitors must not block fire equipment or emergency exits.

Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring their pens and their immediate surrounds are kept as clean and as safe as possible, for the duration of the show. Soil from pens must be removed and placed in the designated area.

The blue/pink baling twine from around the straw bales, must be disposed of in a bin and not left on the ground, posing a trip hazard. All human food waste (e.g. plates, cups) must be disposed of in a bin.

Pets, excluding disability assistance dogs, are not permitted on site.

Smoking is not permitted indoors or within 20 metres of the food vans and entry points to the Pavilion and Skillion.

Emergency Procedure

The shows Emergency Warden is: *Matthew Smith*. In the event of an emergency remain calm and follow the Wardens instructions.

The Emergency Assembly Area is the livestock yards to the right of Gate 3, in the open grass area.

Evacuation Phases

1. Immediately move all people away from the danger.
2. Move people to a safe area.
3. Evacuate affected parts of the venue.
4. Total evacuation of the venue.

In the event of an evacuation warning, all persons are to immediately evacuate away from the danger area by the nearest and safest route to a safe area.

If further evacuation is required, remain under the control of the Warden. Ensure everyone is accounted for and report missing persons to the Warden at the Assembly Area.

Remember - Safety is everybody's responsibility!
